MOSCOW-(By Staff Correspondent of The Associated Press)-Nov. 16 .- "If you see a Cheks agent on the right side of the street, take the left side." is a common saving in Russia, showing the fear instilled by the secret police which is credited here with untold crimes and violence. Its agents lock up people, try and execute them at will, according to popular information. As there are no police in Russia, it devolves on this organization to keep the peace and, when necessary, control the Red army.

While traveling through the entire length of Russia, The Associated Press correspondent was shadowed, from city to city, by these agents, but never bothered by them. As in Turkey, their mission was possibly mark. to protect the correspondent and not involve the Soviet government in" fresh complications regarding its treatment of Americans.
