YORK, Nov. 18 .- An imnediate reduction of 10 per cent in carload freight rates on farm products, for six months, agreed upon today by railroad executives.

Announcing the decision, Thomas Dewitt Cuyler, president of the Association of Railway Executives. stated that any reductions in such rates made since September 1, 1920 were to be included in the 10 per cent and that it would be put inte effect without awaiting a reduction in wages. The freight rate cut will apply throughout the eatire country. except on traffic moving wholly in New England.

The new rates are applicable to carloads of wheat, corn, oats, other grain, flour and meat, hay, straw and alfalfa, manufactured tobacco cotton, cotton seed and products except cotton seed oil and cotton seed meals, citrus fruits, othe fresh fruits, potatoes, other regetables, dried fruits and vegetables, horses and mules, cattle and calves, sheep and goats, hogs, poultry, eggs, butter and cheese, and wool.
