Mistaken For Soldier Standard Oil Collector Is Victim Of Ghastly Practice

PEKING, Nov. 6.—(By Mail)—Hundreds of Southern or Szechuanese, prisoners have been decapitated by the Northern defenders of Ichang, according to reports brought to Peking by foreigners who have been visiting the Ichang front.

These atrocities were brought to General Wu Pei-fu's attention on his arrival at Ichang owing to the fact that some of the original garrison one day mistook a Chinese collector for the Standard Oil company for a Southern soldier and cut off his head in the usual manner.

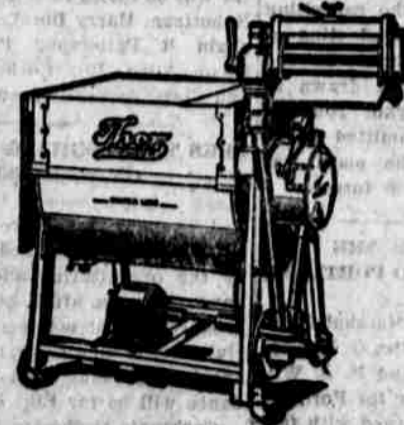
