

**INDIAN RELIC IS FOUND ON UPPER LAKE**

**HEAD OF INDIAN CHIEF IS CAREFULLY SCULPTURED OUT OF PUMICE STONE**

George Grizzle has been presented with a unique find by A. W. Wakefield, in form of a bit of pumice stone, showing a crude bit of sculpturing which might have been the work of Indians centuries ago. It is in the form of the head of an Indian chief and looks as if it had been chiselled out of the pumice stone with some sharp instrument or tool of flint.

Mr. Wakefield found the curio while walking along the bank where the dredge had been working for the C. O. P., on the Upper Lake, between the Lamm mill and Wood river. It is about six inches long and three inches in width. The pumice stone, from which the figure is sculptured is dark gray, while the only pumice stone found in this region is light in color, and none has ever been found in this section nearer than Crater Lake. It is thought its dark color may have been due to exposure to the elements or have been caused by being buried many years beneath the surface. It had evidently been thrown up by the dredge, which had been trenching about eight feet beneath the bed of the lake at the point where the curio was found.

**C. R. SMITH LANDS BIG RAINBOW TROUT**

Another large rainbow trout was taken in Klamath county fishing waters by C. R. Smith, chief operator of the Keno power plant of the California-Oregon Power company yesterday afternoon about one mile north of the dam in the Klamath river.

The trout measured 35 inches and weighed 13 pounds. It was taken on an ordinary spinner and staged a game battle before being landed.

Smith claims that this is the banner catch of the season and that it outdoes the catch made by Dr. Sykes of Oakland earlier in the season. The fish will be photographed and measured for sending to Portland where records of Oregon big fish, as well as pictures are incorporated in Oregon publicity records.
