It seems as though more people than ever are demanding choicer cuts, and their demand sets the price. If few people sak for the forequarter cuts, the price of forequarters will automatically drop to a figure low enough to induce people to buy because of cheapness.

Even though certain cuts sell for relatively high prices, other cuts, due to lack of demand, sell so low that our profit from all sources over a period of five years. averaged only a fraction of a cent a pound.

It is competition between consumers for the choice cuts that keeps prices for those cuts relatively high; an lising demand for all parts of the carcass would hefit producer, packer, retailer and consumer.
