

96TH DIVISION UNITS ARE ASSIGNED

Forty-three units of the 96th division of the army service corps, with headquarters in Portland, have been assigned to Oregon cities and towns, according to announcement made today by Colonel Pegram Whitworth, who has been placed in charge of the organization of the division.

Under the allocation, Portland gets nine units. They are the special troops, the 151st infantry brigade, the 381st infantry, the 171st field artillery brigade, the 361st field artillery, the 321st engineers, the 96th division air service, the 821st medical regiment and the 96th division train.

The organization of the 96th division, which comprises the states of Oregon and Washington, is a part of the organization of the new army. Various units have been distributed throughout the two states.

Medford gets the 382nd infantry; Ashland 382nd service company; Grants Pass, 382nd howitzer company; Eugene 382nd infantry companies A, B and C, and Roseburg, 382nd infantry, Co. H. (M. G.)

MILLION DOLLAR HIGHWAY BONDS HAVE BEEN SIGNED

SALEM, Nov. 22.—Sam A. Koser, secretary of state, and O. P. Hoff, state treasurer, have completed the task of signing \$1,000,000 of state highway bonds. These bonds were sold by the state highway commission at a meeting held recently in Portland. The money derived from the securities will be expended in new road construction.

WORTHLESS CHECKS BEING PASSED BY AGED WOMAN

OREGON CITY, Nov. 22.—Every few days Sheriff William J. Wilson receives a check for a few dollars from some Oregon City merchant with the information that it was passed by a matronly appearing woman about 60 years of age. The checks vary in amount from \$3.25 to \$4.75, are always drawn on the First National bank of Canby, but are signed with different names.

LAKE COUNTY SHERIFF RECAPTURES JAIL BREAKERS

Sheriff E. E. Woodcock of Lake county last night rounded up the last prisoner of the eight who broke jail in Lakeview Friday night, near the Klamath county border and returned him to Lakeview. Two of the men who escaped were captured while headed for the Nevada border line.

Files and a hack-saw were slipped to the prisoners in the Lakeview jail and they succeeded in escaping early Friday morning. Five of the prisoners were captured in a straw stack within two miles of the city on the afternoon of the outbreak.

ABANDONS CATTLE BREEDING ON LURE OF OIL WELL

MODESTO, Cal., Nov. 22.—J. G. Ramsey of Modesto, who has been one of the successful breeders of Holsteins in Stanislaus County, has yielded to the lure of the Texas oil fields. At the sale of the San Joaquin County Holstein Breeders, he dispersed all his herd, save four, which he is reserving as a nucleus for another herd which he may establish later.

MOTORISTS ARE IGNORING TRAFFIC REGULATIONS

Traffic Officer McLaughlin has been quite busy the past week arresting motorists who fail to keep the rear light on their machines burning and the list of callers at the city hall is growing daily. The people have been warned repeatedly this past summer, also arrested, for neglecting the lights on their cars. Recently, motorists, have been ignoring the warnings issued during the summer. The raid is taking place nightly on all motorists who fail to obey the traffic laws.

The officer is starting a campaign on the automobilists who persist in driving over Klamath, Main and Pine streets, as well as up Ninth street. The slippery condition of the pavements makes it practically an impossibility to stop short should a pedestrian or a car appear ahead of the driver and accidents may take place any time when excess speed is used. Crossing at intersections is set at 5 miles an hour, and speed on streets ten miles an hour.

"For the safety of everyone, drive cars at a moderate pace before someone is killed during the wet pavement period," the traffic officer requests of car drivers.
