

BANS ARBUCKLE TALK

Mayor Rolph Refuses to Permit Discussion in City Hall

SAN FRANCISCO, Dec. 13.—Women's club circles were buzzing here with discussion of Mayor Rolph's ban on discussion of the Arbuckle case within the precincts of the city hall.

The Housewives' league, which was to have heard a report from Mrs. Robert A. Dean, chairman of the women's vigilance committee, which

sat through the Arbuckle trial, adjourned their meeting when they learned Mrs. Dean had been requested by the mayor "as a courtesy to his administration" to refrain from making her address.

"We cannot meet in the city hall if our rights to discuss any subject are abridged," said Mrs. Dean.

The Arbuckle jury cost the state \$2389.06 during the period it was locked up, according to a report on file today. Meals cost \$999.45 and rooms \$1084.
