**Officer of Paris
Fame Given Office
In San Francisco**

SAN FRANCISCO, Dec. 17.—Colonel Charles E. Stanton, veteran army officer, who sprang into fame when, during the war, he uttered at the tomb of Lafayette in Paris the words, "Lafayette, we are here," recently became commissioner of the board of public works of San Francisco.

Colonel Stanton retired from active service in the army recently after being in the uniform for nearly twenty-five years. Several years were spent with General Pershing in the

Philippines and when Pershing went to France he took with him Colonel Stanton as disbursing officer.

For his excellence in handling the financial affairs of the American Expeditionary Forces, Colonel Stanton received the highest decoration in the nation gives the men in its service.

Army officers here described Colonel Stanton as "the most celebrated toastmaster in the service." He went onto the retired list as a colonel.
