SEATTLE, Dec. 29.—Christmas has gone, and with it hundreds of jobs for Seattle's army of unemployed.

During the past month the holiday season has provided work for many, but with the approach of the new year the peak of the unemployment situation nears.

Officials of the city's free employment bureau placed the number of jobless here at over 10,000.
