**PETRIFIED LOGS FOUND
 IN ANCIENT RIVER BED**

GRASS VALLEY, Calif., Dec. 30.—Logs, buried in ancient river beds for thousands, perhaps millions of years, are encountered in a long tunnel which is being driven at Iowa Hill, Placer county, by a Pittsburg mining syndicate. The logs are not

petrified, but are well preserved, being in some cases heavily impregnated with mineral matter.

A frothy substance found on plants variously known as "frog spit," "cuckoo spit" and "toad spit," is exuded by the larva of the spittle insect, which lives under the mass of "spit." The latter consists of juice sucked from the plants.
