That soap is good to eat is the latest discovery of a certain noted scientist. Which, no doubt, accounts for the chap who is always bubbling over with good nature.

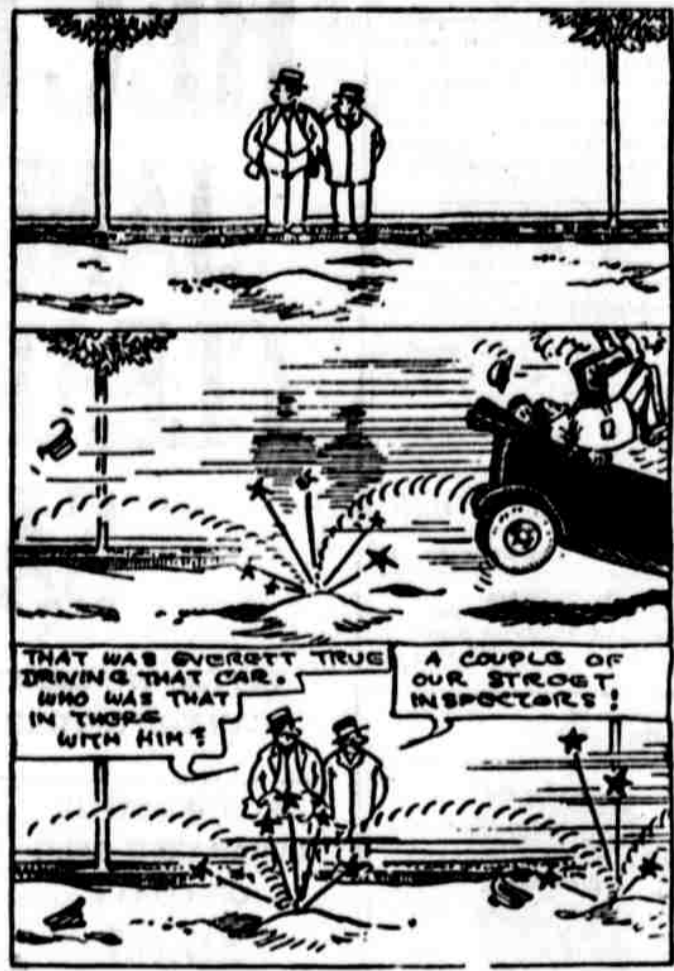

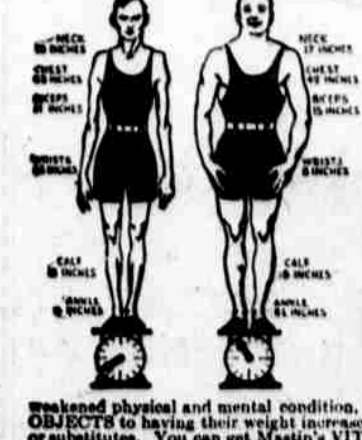
