91 WATER PERMITS GRANTED BY CUPPER IN THREE MONTHS

SALEM, Jan. 24.—During the months of October, November and December, ninety-one permits to appropriate water and eight permits to store water were issued by State Engineer, Percy A. Cupper. These permits contemplate the irrigation of a total of 2395 acres of land, the construction of ninety miles of canal lines, the development of 7155 horsepower, and the appropriation of water for mining, municipal, domestic, and various other purposes, at an estimated cost of \$415,000.00. The reservoirs are expected to store 8150 acre feet of water at an estimated construction cost amounting to \$113,000.00.

Among the more important permits issued are:

The permit to the City of McMinnville for the construction of a storage reservoir of 5000 acre feet capacity on the Nestucca River, and the construction of a tunnel, canal, power house, and transmission line for the development of 5007 horsepower on Walker Creek for municipal purposes at an estimated cost of \$350,000.00.

The permit to the Nibler Lumber company of Walla Walla, Oregon, for the development of 405 horsepower on the Walla Walla River, at an estimated cost of \$15,000.00.

The permit to the Bourne Gold Mining Company of Portland, for the development of 552 horsepower with the waters of Cracker and Little Cracker Creek for mining purposes in the Bourne Gold Mining District of Baker County, at an estimated cost of \$5,000.00.

The permit to the Clear Creek Water Users Association of Halfway, Oregon, for the appropriation of water from the West Fork of Clear Creek for the irrigation of 475 acres in Baker County.

The permit to the War Eagle Mining Company of Medford, Oregon, for the appropriation of water from Morrison Creek for domestic, irrigation and mining purposes, which it is estimated will cost \$15,000.00.

The permit to the Town of Myrtle Creek in Douglas County for the appropriation of water from Harrison Young Creek for a municipal water supply will cost approximately \$15,000.00.

The permit to the City of Myrtle Point in Coos County, for the construction of a reservoir on John Creek and the appropriation of the water for municipal purposes at an estimated expenditure of \$22,500.00.

The permit to the Elk City Water Company of Lincoln county for the appropriation of water for municipal supply, from Dixon Creek.

The permit to the Kays Anderson Lumber Company of Lane county for the appropriation of water from Chickabonny Creek for the purpose of fluming lumber.

The permit to the United Mining Company of Unity, Oregon, for the appropriation of water from the South Fork of Burnt River for development of 75 horsepower for mining purposes.

EXAMS TO BE HELD FOR POSTOFFICE CLERK

The United States Civil Service Commission announces a Post Office Clerk-Carrier examination, to be held on Feb. 18, 1923, for the purpose of establishing an eligible register from which selections may be made to fill vacancies as they may occur in the position of Clerk or Carrier, Post Office Service, Klamath Falls, Oregon. Salary, \$1,400.00 per annum.

All citizens of the United States who meet the requirements, both men and women, may enter this examination; appointing officers, however, have the legal right to specify the sex desired in requesting certification of eligibles. Age limits, 18 to 45 years on the date of the examination. Age limits do not apply to persons entitled to preference on account of military or naval service.

Many Contribute to R. R. Conscience Fund

SAN FRANCISCO, Jan. 24.—Persons stealing rides on trains often pay full fare, whether they are caught or not, according to officials in charge of the "conscience fund" of the Southern Pacific lines here.

From 1907 to 1921 \$1,164.67 was contributed to the fund. One woman sent \$50 because her conscience troubled her after she had allowed her 6½-year-old child to ride free from Missoula, Montana, to San Diego, California, and return. Three one-cent stamps, were received from a man who had unknowingly ridden free from Melrose to Havenscourt, near Oakland, California. An employee in Los Angeles refunded \$5.13 as a result of overcharge in his expense account.

Many of the contributors said they were squaring accounts because they had been converted by religious workers.
