PUBLIC WHIPPING

POST TO BE URGED FOR WASHINGTON

TACOMA, Wash., Feb. 2.—Establishment of public whipping posts in Washington state will be urged before the next legislature by Justice John W. Linck, he announced following hearing a recent case in his court.

The case involved a man charged with neglecting his wife and three children while he spent all his money on himself.

"I don't care what your name is," said the state judge, "but it ought to be 'Mud.' Any man with a heart wouldn't let his children go hungry while he is away making his own living. If it were in my power I would send you to a whipping post, and I am going to recommend to the legislature that the whipping post be re-established for such characters as you."

The man was sentenced to six months in jail with the addition that he remain there until he put up \$500 bond to support his family.
