

Milk is immediately removed from the barn to a modern milk house, where it is strained, cooled, aerated and filtered through cotton.

It then is put into cans that have been sterilized with live steam, and is taken to the Klamath Falls plant, where the same careful, sanitary methods are used in pasteurizing and bottling.
