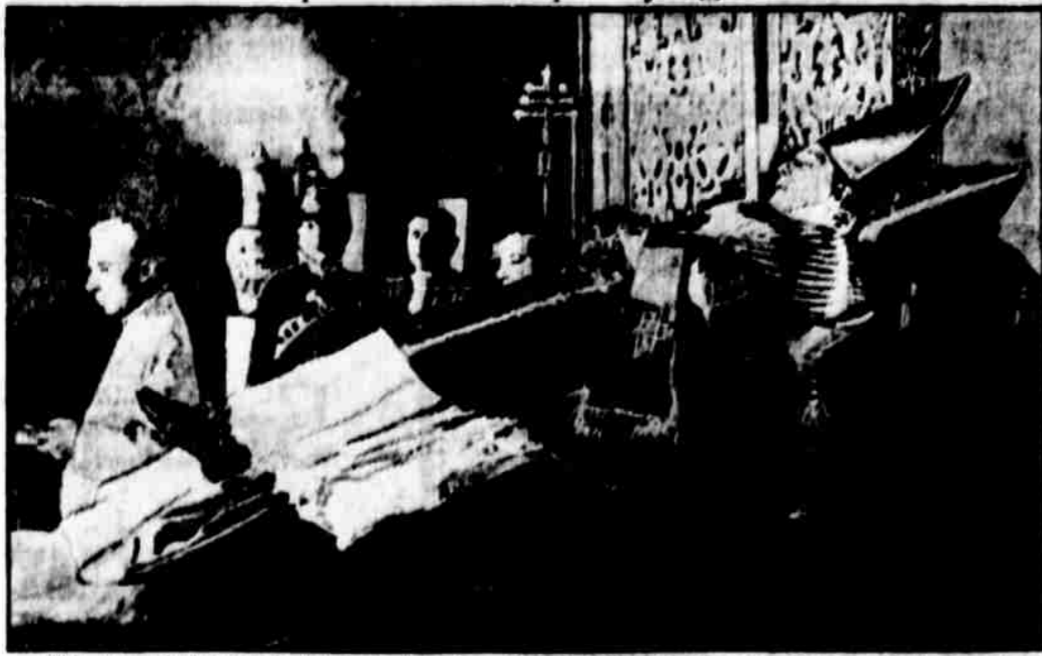

BOY SCOUTS ALLIES OF FOREST RANGERS IN FIRE CAMPAIGN

PORTLAND, Feb. 10.—Forest officers are interested in the Boy Scout anniversary for the Scouts are coming to be recognized by the forest rangers as allies in the fire campaign that is being waged on the national forests of the Northwest. Reports received by the District Forester from the twenty-two forests in Oregon and Washington show that Boy Scouts use portions of twenty of these National Forests each summer for hiking or camping trip. On some forests the Scouts have taken a very active part in fire prevention and fire suppression, realizing that this denotes a good woodsman.

These reports show that Boy Scouts are coming to appreciate the National Forests, from the Crater Forest in southern Oregon, to the far away Chugach Forest, in Alaska. In southern Oregon, Boy Scouts from Medford and Ashland have taken hikes into the Crater Forest, camping for ten days at some of the mountain lakes in the Cascades. NOTED SURGEON SUBMITS TO SIMPLE GLAND OPERATION; IS REJUVENATED

NEW YORK, Feb. 10.—After astonishing many American practitioners for several months by his indefatigable work in performing hundreds of bloodless operations for charity, Dr. Adolf Lorenz, aged Austrian orthopedic surgeon, has revealed that he attributes his energy to having submitted to a delicate operation known as "Steinach's method of rejuvenation."

The operation, painless as those he himself performs, was gone through by r. Lorenz, who is 67, just before leaving Vienna for the United States last fall, according to the New York World.

Operation Simple

The fact that he had undergone the operation with the hope of thereby having his years of usefulness to humanity lengthened, was announced by Dr. Dexter D. Ashley, at whose home the famous surgeon has been seeing patients, the newspaper stated. It was performed by Dr. Blau of Vienna.

The operation, as described by its originator, Dr. Eugene Steinach, is "a very simple affair."
"Absolutely painless; quite free from any risk whatsoever. It takes no longer than fifteen minutes to perform. Seven to ten days in the hospital are all that is needed. But the operation must be performed with minute precision."

Attacks Disappear

Dr. Steinach is said to operate on a gland which has properties both reproductive and vivifying. By a simple ligation the productive property of the gland is obliterated, when the other property is intensified. It involves no transplantation of glands.

Shortly after Dr. Lorenz began his work here last year he underwent several attacks of weakness and fainting. These are now said to have passed, leaving the aged surgeon in the heartiest of physical condition. It is said that it requires several months for the result of the Steinach operation to assert itself.
