Revenues of Fall River Mills R.P. Goes to County FALL RIVER MILLS, Calif., Feb. 21.—Fall River Mills is on what is probably the only railroad in the United States which turns over all its freight revenues to county officials for road work in this section.

The road, an electric line, was built some time ago by the Pacific Gas and Electric company, to haul supplies from Battle to its big hydro-electric development work in this section.

As highways and usable wagon roads are few in this section the residents asked that the company haul their freight during the winter when the roads cannot be used.

The company agreed to this and arranged to charge shippers but to deposit the money received in a local bank for highway work.

NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION HORSEFLY IRRIGATION DISTRICT OF KLAMATH COUNTY, OREGON. Notice is hereby given that a special election will be held on Wednesday the 22nd day of March A. D. 1922 within the Horsefly Irrigation District of Klamath County, Oregon for the purpose of determining whether a certain contract shall be entered into between the said Horsefly Irrigation District and the United States of America for the proportionate share of the cost of construction of certain irrigation works to be used jointly by the Langel Valley Irrigation District and the said Horsefly Irrigation District.

First: That the persons who have joined in and signed this petition are the owners of more than fifty per cent, to-wit: the owners of 54.98 per cent, as shown by the records of Klamath County, Oregon, of the acreage contained in and comprising the body of land hereinafter described, and the boundaries of which are hereinafter particularly set forth.

Second: That the body of land which your petitioners desire to be incorporated into a drainage district is a contiguous body of swamp, wet and overflowed lands, situate in Klamath County, Oregon.

Third: That your petitioners desire to form a drainage district under the laws of the State of Oregon, comprising, embracing and composed of the lands within the boundaries hereinafter set forth and described, for the purpose of having such and said lands reclaimed and protected by drainage from the effects of water for agricultural purposes, and in order to contribute to the public health, convenience and welfare and for public utility and benefit.

Fourth: That the name proposed for such district is "MEADOWS DRAINAGE DISTRICT."

Fifth: The boundary lines of the proposed district are as follows, to-wit: Beginning at the Northwest corner of Section 6, Township 34 South, Range 7 1/2 East of the Willamette Meridian; thence South along the center line between Ranges 6 and 7 1/2 East of the Willamette Meridian a distance of 36,333 feet, more or less, to the corner of Townships 34 and 25 South, Range 6 and 7 1/2 East of the Willamette Meridian; thence continuing south on said Range line a distance of 23,760 feet, more or less, to the one-quarter corner common to Sections 29, Township 35 South, Range 7 1/2 East of the Willamette Meridian and Section 25, Township 35 South, Range 6 East of the Willamette Meridian; thence East along the center line of said Section 30 to the intersection with the northern boundary of Upper Klamath Lake; thence Easterly, following the meanders of said northern boundary of Upper Klamath Lake to the intersection with the line between Lots 3 and 4 in Section 29 of said Township and Range; thence North along said line between said Lots 3 and 4 to the East and West center line of said Section 29; thence East along said center line of said Section 29 to the one-quarter corner of said Section 29; thence North along the line between Sections 29 and 28 of said Township and Range to the Northwest corner of Lot 2 of said Section 28; thence East along the line between Lots 2 and 3 in said Section 28 to the Western boundary of the straight connecting Upper Klamath Lake with Agency Lake; thence northerly along the Western boundary of said straits and Agency Lake through Sections 28 and 31 and 16 of said Township and Range to the Southeast corner of Lot 4 in Section 19 of said Township and Range; thence West to the Southwest corner

of Lot 4 in said Section 19; thence North, along the West line of said Lot 4 to the Northwest corner thereof; thence East along the line between Lot 3 and 2 of said Section 19 to the intersection with the said westerly boundary of Agency Lake; thence Northerly following the meanders of the said Western boundary of Agency Lake to the intersection with the line between Lots 1 and 2 in said Section 19; thence North along the line between said Lots 1 and 2 in said Section 19 to the Northwest corner of Lot 1 of said Section 19; thence East along the North line of said Lot 1 to the Northwest corner of Lot 4 of Section 19 of said Township and Range; thence continuing East along the North line of Lot 3 and 2 in said Section 19, to the Northwest corner of said Lot 2; thence South along the East line of said Lot 2 to the center of said Section 19; thence East along the line between Lots 2 and 6 in said Section 19 to its intersection with the said Western boundary of Agency Lake; thence Northerly following the meanders of the said Western boundary of Agency Lake through said Section 19 to its intersection with the line between said Sections 19 and 3 of said Township and Range; thence West along the line between said Sections 19 and 3 to the Southwest corner of Lot 3 in said Section 3; thence North along the West line of said Lot 3 to the Northwest corner thereof; thence East along the North line of said Lot 3 to the Northeast corner thereof; thence South along the line between Sections 3 and 2 of said Township and Range to the intersection with the said Western boundary of Agency Lake; thence Northerly following the meanders of the said Western boundary of Agency Lake through said Sections 2 and 3 to the meander corner on the line between said Section 3 and Section 24, Township 34 South, Range 7 1/2 East of the Willamette Meridian; thence through Township 34 South following the meanders of the westerly and Northern boundaries of the said Agency Lake through Sections 24, 27, 26 and 25 of Township 34 South, Range 7 1/2 East of the Willamette Meridian to the Western or right bank of Wood River; thence Northerly following the meanders of said Western bank of Wood River through Sections 25, 24, 13, 14, 11, 12, 10, 4 and 3 of said Township and Range to a point in Lot 2 of said Section 3 which is 814 feet South of the North line of said Lot 2; thence West 470 feet; thence South 96 feet; thence West 32 feet; thence South 19 deg. 05 min. West 715 feet; thence North 79 deg. 57 min. West 282 feet to a point on the east line of Lot 4 of Section 4 of said Township and Range which is 1959.5 feet South of the one-quarter corner on the North line of said Section 4; thence North 67 deg. 37 min. West to the North line of said Section 5 of said Township and Range; thence East along the North line of said Section 5 to the Northeast corner of the Southwest one-quarter of said Section 32; thence North 1332 feet to a post situated at the Northeast corner of the Southwest one-quarter of the Southwest one-quarter of Section 29 of said Township and Range; thence West 1232 feet to a post situated at the Northwest corner of said Southwest one-quarter of the Southwest one-quarter of said Section 29; thence North along the line between Sections 29 and 30 of said Township and Range 2644 feet to a post situated at the Northeast corner of the South one-half of the Northeast quarter of said Section 31; thence East along the center line of said Sections 31 and 32 to a point 360 feet East of the one-quarter corner between said Sections 31 and 32; thence South to a point on the South line of said Section 32 which is 260 feet East of the Southwest corner thereof; thence West along the South line of said Sections 32 and 31 to the Southwest corner of Section 6, Township 34 South, Range 7 1/2 East of the Willamette Meridian being the place of beginning, containing in all 27,542.84 acres.

AND YOUR PETITIONERS FURTHER ALLEGE, as stated hereinbefore, that such lands constitute a contiguous body of swamp, wet and overflowed lands.

SEVENTH: The names of the owners of land in said proposed district as shown by the records of Klamath County, and the acreage owned by each of such owners, are as follows: W. W. JONES, 2,233.54 acres, E. H. REAMES, 6,436.14 acres, Fort Klamath Meadows Co., 12,218.10 acres, Estate of J. G. Pierce, 69.95 acres, C. R. National Bank, Portland, Ore., 5416 acres, D. H. Campbell, 75.61 acres, Total, 27,542.84 acres.

EIGHTH: That the proposed reclamation, as stated hereinbefore, is for agricultural purposes and that such proposed reclamation will be conducive to the public health and welfare and will be of public utility and benefit.

NINTH: That all of the lands included in said proposed district are properly included therein and will be beneficially affected by the operation of the proposed district.

TENTH: That the benefits of such proposed reclamation will exceed the damage to be done and that the best interests of the land included and of the owners of such land as a whole, and of the public at large, will be promoted by the formation and proposed operation of such district.

ELEVENTH: That the formation of a drainage district under the provisions of the laws of the State of Oregon, to-wit: Chapter 11 of the Oregon Laws and Amendments thereto, is a proper and advantageous method of accomplishing the reclamation and protection of the lands included therein.

THIRTEENTH: And your petitioners, whose signatures are attached to this petition, hereby obligate themselves, and their successors, in interest in said lands, that they will pay any and all expenses incurred and any tax or taxes that may be levied against their lands for the purpose of paying the expense of organizing or attempting to organize the proposed district.

WHEREFORE your petitioners pray that the lands described and included within the boundaries herein set forth, or such of them as may be found by the court to be properly included in the proposed district, either permanently or until further investigation and surveys may permit elimination, shall be declared organized into a drainage district, and your petitioners will ever pray.
