NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that hearing on the following petition will be held at the County Court Room in the Court House of Klamath County, Oregon, in the City of Klamath Falls, County of Klamath, State of Oregon, on the 20th day of March A. D. 1922 at the hour of 2 o'clock in the afternoon of said day, for the purpose of determining whether the prayer of said petition shall be granted.

All persons owning or claiming an interest in land, described in said petition are hereby notified to appear at said time at said place on said date and show cause, if any there be, why the prayer in said petition should not be granted.

IN THE COUNTY COURT OF THE STATE OF OREGON FOR KLAMATH COUNTY

PETITION FOR ORGANIZATION TO THE HONORABLE COUNTY COURT OF KLAMATH COUNTY, OREGON

We, the undersigned, your petitioners herein, show to your honorable body the following:
First: That the persons who have joined in and signed this petition are the owners of more than fifty per cent, to-wit: the owners of 54.98 per cent, as shown by the records of Klamath County, Oregon, of the acreage contained in and comprising the body of land hereinafter described, and the boundaries of which are hereinafter particularly set forth.

Second: That the body of land which your petitioners desire to be incorporated into a drainage district is a contiguous body of swamp, wet and overflowed lands situate in Klamath County, Oregon.

Third: That your petitioners desire to form a drainage district under the laws of the State of Oregon, comprising, embracing and composed of the lands within the boundaries hereinafter set forth and described, for the purpose of having such said lands reclaimed and protected by drainage from the effects of water for agricultural purposes, and in order to contribute to the public health, convenience and welfare and for public utility and benefit.

Fourth: The name proposed for such district is "MEADOWS DRAINAGE DISTRICT."

Fifth: The boundary lines of the proposed district are as follows, to-wit: Beginning at the Northwest corner of Section 6, Township 34 South, Range 7 1/2 East of the Willamette Meridian; thence South along the line between Ranges 6 and 7 1/2 East of the Willamette Meridian, a distance of 36,533 feet, more or less, to the corner of Townships 34 and 35 South, Range 6 and 7 1/2 East of the Willamette Meridian; thence continu-

uing south on said Range line a distance of 23,760 feet, more or less, to the one-quarter corner common to Sections 30, Township 35 South, Range 7 1/2 East of the Willamette Meridian and Section 25, Township 35 South, Range 6 East of the Willamette Meridian; thence East along the center line of said Section 30 to the intersection with the northerly boundary of Upper Klamath Lake; thence Easterly, following the meanders of said northerly boundary of Upper Klamath Lake to the intersection with the line between Lots 3 and 4 in Section 29 of said Township and Range; thence north along said line between said Lots 3 and 4 to the East and West center line of said Section 29; thence East along said center line of said Section 29 to the one-quarter corner on the east line of said Section 29; thence North along the line between Sections 29 and 28 of said Township and Range to the Northwest corner of Lot 2 of said Section 28; thence East along the line between Lots 2 and 1 in said Section 28 to the Westerly boundary of the strait, connecting Upper Klamath Lake with Agency Lake; thence northerly along the Westerly boundary of said strait and Agency Lake through Sections 28 and 21 and 15 of said Township and Range to the Southeast corner of Lot 4 in Section 9 of said Township and Range; thence West to the Southwest corner of Lot 4 in said Section 9; thence North, along the West line of said Lot 4 to the Northwest corner thereof; thence East along the line between Lots 4 and 3 of said Section 9 to the intersection with the said westerly boundary of Agency Lake; thence Northerly following the meanders of the said Westerly boundary of Agency Lake to the intersection with the line between Lots 1 and 2 in said Section 9; thence North along the line between said Lots 1 and 2 in said Section 9 to the Northwest corner of Lot 1 of said Section 9; thence East along the North line of said Lot 1 to the Northwest corner of Lot 4 of Section 10 of said Township and Range; thence continuing East along the North line of Lot 4 in said Section 10, to the Northeast corner of said Lot 3; thence South along the East line of said Lot 3 to the center of said Section 10; thence East along the line between Lots 2 and 6 in said Section 10 to its intersection with the said Westerly boundary of Agency Lake; thence Northerly following the meanders of the said Westerly boundary of Agency Lake through said Section 10 to its intersection with the line between said Sections 10 and 3 of said Township and Range; thence West along the line between said Sections 10 and 3 to the Southwest corner of Lot 3 in said Section 3; thence North along the West line of said Lot 3 to the Northwest corner thereof; thence East along the North line of said Lot 3 to the Northeast corner thereof; thence South along the line between Sections 3 and 2 of said Township and Range to the intersection with the said Westerly boundary of Agency Lake; thence Northerly following the meanders of the said Westerly boundary of Agency Lake through said Sections 2 and 3 to the meander corner on the line between said Section 3 and Section 34, Township 34 South, Range 7 1/2 East of the Willamette Meridian; thence through Township 34 South following the meanders of the westerly and northerly boundaries of the said Agency Lake through Sections 34, 27, 26 and 25 of Township 34 South, Range 7 1/2 East of the Willamette Meridian to the Westerly or right bank of Wood River; thence Northerly following the meanders of said Westerly bank of Wood River through Sections 25, 24, 12, 14, 11, 10, 3, and 4 of said Township and Range to a point in Lot 2 of said Section 3 which is 814 feet South of the North line of said Lot 2; thence West 470 feet; thence South 96 feet; thence West 32 feet; thence South 19 deg. 45 min. West 150 feet; thence North 29 deg. 57 min. West 2832 feet to a point on the east line of Lot 4 of Section 4 of said Township and Range which is 1989.5 feet South of the one-quarter corner on the North line of said Section 4; thence North 67 deg. 37 min. West to the North line of said Section 5 of said Township and Range; thence West along the North line of said Section 5 to the Southeast corner of the West half of the Southeast quarter of Section 32 in Township 33 South, Range 7 1/2 East of the Willamette Meridian; thence North along the East line of the West half of the East half of said Section 32; thence Northeast corner of the Southwest one-quarter of said Section 32; thence West 2460 feet along the North line of the South one-half of the North one-half of said Section 32 to the Northwest corner of the Southeast one-quarter of the Northwest one-quarter of said Section 32; thence North 1333 feet to a post situated at the Northeast corner of the Northwest one-quarter of the Northwest one-quarter of said Section 32; thence North 1333 feet to a post situated at the Northeast corner of the Southwest one-quarter of the Southwest one-quarter of said Section 32; thence West 1335 feet to a post situated at the Northwest corner of said Southwest one-quarter of the Southwest one-quarter of said Section 29; thence North along the line between Sections 29 and 30 of said Township and Range 2644 feet to a post situated at the Northeast corner of the South one-half of the Northeast quarter of said Section 30; thence West along the North line of said South half of the Northeast quarter of said Section 30 to the Northwest corner thereof; thence South along the center line of Sections 30 and 31 of said Township and Range to the center of said Section 31; thence East along the center line of said Sections 31 and 32 to a point 360 feet East of the one-quarter corner between said Sections 31 and 32; thence South to a point on the South line of said Section 33 which is 360 feet East of the Southwest corner thereof; thence West along the South line of said Sections 32 and 31 to the Northwest corner of Section 8, Township 34 South, Range 7 1/2 East of the Willamette Meridian being the place of beginning, containing in all 27,542.84 acres.

Sixth: The total acreage included in said proposed district is 27,542.84 acres, all situated in Klamath County, Oregon.
Seventh: The names of the owners of land in said proposed district as shown by the records of Klamath County, and the acreage owned by each of such owners, are as follows: W. W. Jones, 6,444.34 acres. W. K. Brown, 2,232.54 acres. E. R. Reames, 6,454.14 acres. Fort Klamath Meadows Co., 12,218.10 acres. Estate of J. G. Pierce, 60.95 acres. U. S. National Bank, Portland, Ore., 54.16 acres. D. B. Campbell, 75.61 acres. Total, 27,542.84 acres.
Eighth: That the proposed reclamation, as stated hereinbefore, is for agricultural purposes and that such proposed reclamation will be conducive to the public health and welfare and will be of public utility and benefit.
Ninth: That all of the lands included in said proposed district are properly included therein and will be beneficially affected by the operation of the proposed district.
Tenth: That the benefits of such proposed reclamation will exceed the damage to be done and that the best interests of the land included and of the owners of such land as a whole, and of the public at large, will be promoted by the formation and proposed operations of such district.
Eleventh: That the formation of a drainage district under the provisions of the laws of the State of Oregon, to-wit: Chapter 11 of Oregon Laws and Amendments thereto, is a proper and advantageous method of accomplishing the reclamation and protection of the lands included therein.
Twelfth: The proposed plan of Reclamation is: The reclamation works will consist of a levee entirely around the project of sufficient height and width to keep out the lake and flood waters; also a system of main drains traversing the property and leading to a pumping station which will pump water from the drains into the Lake. The pump to be of sufficient capacity to handle all the seepage water brought to it by the drains. The main drains to have a system of lateral drains entering them in such locations and of such capacity as may be determined as necessary to carry away all seepage water entering the tract.
Thirteenth: And your petitioners, whose signatures are attached to this petition, hereby obligate themselves, and their successors in interest in said lands, that they will pay any and all expenses incurred and any tax or taxes that may be levied against their lands, for the purpose of paying the expense of organizing or attempting to organize the proposed district.
WHEREFORE, your petitioners pray that the lands described and included within the boundaries herein set forth, or such of them as may be found by the court to be properly included in the proposed district, either permanently or until further investigation and surveys may permit elimination, shall be declared organized into a drainage district, and your petitioners will ever pray.
