LOWER FREIGHT RATES FIRST WORK OF FARM BLOC

(Continued from Page 1) Credits Next in Importance "Next to the matter of transportation is the question of agricultural credits. We are just now getting shaped up a new credit bill, based on the findings of the joint agricultural commission, which would set up new machinery for more adequate credit through the federal farm loan board.

There is now a gap between the short-term 60-day and 90-day paper and the long-term mortgage loan on land which must be filled. "There is a need for credits running from six months to three years to farmers and stock raisers to enable them to make the necessary turnover in their products.

Bloc Proud of Record

"That the farm bloc has been able to get things done is due to the fact that the things for which it has fought have been fundamentally correct. Among the more notable of these measures have been: "1st. The Capper-Volstead cooperative marketing bill. "2nd. The future trading bill, regulating grain exchanges. "3rd. The revival of the war finance corporation as an aid to helping move farm products. "4th. Increasing funds available for loans by the farm loan board by \$50,000,000. "5th. Passage by the senate of the bill giving agriculture a representative on the federal reserve board. "The farm bloc is going to allow

no let-up in its activities. There is a big job ahead, and the biggest proposition is to work out a constructive national program for agriculture.

Farm Conditions Bad "All developments of the past 10 years have shown that conditions are fundamentally bad with respect to agriculture. "There has been a steady drift from the farm to the city. "There have been smaller and smaller profits for farmers. "Tenancy has steadily increased. "An altogether alarming situation requires that congress, act to put agriculture on its feet. "The bloc has been fighting along economic, not party lines. It represents a union of those forces interested in helping agriculture and general economic conditions regardless of party affiliations. "I do not believe the bloc will develop any new party alignment. But it will hold, on economic questions affecting agriculture, a strong bi-partisan following."
