

DELZELL REVEALS WORK OF P. O. FOR PAST EIGHT YEARS

By W. A. Delzell, Postmaster My successor in office having been chosen, he will soon receive his commission and become the new postmaster of Klamath Falls.

Taking charge of the office in November 1913, under a commission from President Woodrow Wilson, it has been my fortune to be postmaster through the trying period of the great world war when our government placed new and unusual burdens and responsibilities upon its postmasters.

One of the first extra duties imposed upon our branch of the service was to assist the army and navy in securing enlistments. In this work the Klamath Falls office made a remarkable record.

Another heavy responsibility was the labor incident to the War Savings campaign. Without warning or extra help—not even an accounting system at first, our office was made a distributing point from this county and many thousands of dollars worth of war saving stamps were placed in my hands with directions to distribute them to the 26 other offices in the county which were then accounting to this office.

Register Aliens The alien enemies were to be registered—this would come under the department of justice, but as no marshals were available in Klamath county, this duty was given the postmaster.

With all these added duties it is well to recall that we were badly handicapped in our regular postal work by our efficient clerks going to war and leaving their places to be filled by inexperienced help.

Finally, when the war was over we were again borrowed by the war department to assist in the sale of surplus army supplies.

Five Clerks Employed On taking charge of the office in 1913, the office was located in the Murdock building between Second and Third streets.

(Mrs. Rosa Torrey and Maud Nall) braved the danger of crossing the ice on foot from Odessa to Algoma to meet the Fort Klamath stage and come on in for their mail.

When the ten year lease expired in 1920 on the Murdock building, new quarters were secured under competitive bids. The office was relocated in the Evans' building at 10th and Main.

My successor, Mr. McCall, will take over a force of eight clerks, four city carriers, mail messenger and one rural route. The star routes include the Lakeview run of 121 miles daily.

The postmaster is the one government official whose duties bring him into contact with all the citizens of his community. He waits upon all, the rich and poor; the high and lowly; the grown-ups and kiddies; saint and sinner; homefolks and strangers.

Another kind of inquiries which always touch the heart-strings is the appeal of mothers back east for word from wandering sons who neglect to write home.

In closing I wish to especially thank the press of the city for the many, many favors I have received from them. Always willing to cooperate in the betterment of the service, never carping or even critical unless it could be in a constructive way.

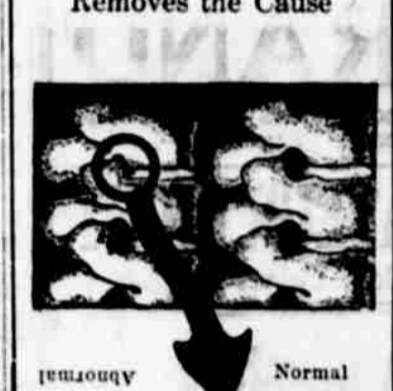
