AUTO BUSINESS SHOWS BIG GAIN

California Has Increase of 43 Per Cent During First Three Months

SAN FRANCISCO, April 15.—Statistics which have just been made public show an increase in motor car business throughout California of 43 per cent for the first three months of 1922 in comparison with the initial three months of 1921.

Big Gain South
Eleven counties in Southern California gained 61 per cent in car numbers, the mark of this territory being 15,915 motor vehicles in three months of 1922 compared to 9,308 for the same length of time in 1921.

Gain Almost Unbelievable
The increases among those who gained, north and south, was in many cases almost unbelievable, and the statement of the exact improvement which was made in sales would probably be quickly discredited if the motor vehicle office registration figures were not available for checking purposes.

Employment Increases
Automobile manufacturing centers, as well as the Ohio city responsible for the great bulk of tire building, show the greatest gain in payrolls, according to figures recently released by Firestone statisticians.

Standard Equipment

OREGON STANDS HIGH

Is Near Head of List in Number of Cars Per Capita

Oregon stands near the head of the list in the proportion of automobiles to the population, according to figures compiled by the Automotive Industries, New York. For every 6.76 residents of the state one car is registered, Oregon being seventh on the list.

A total of 10,565,669 cars and trucks are registered in the United States, from which fees amounting to \$122,038,613 were collected from the owners.

It appears that the agricultural states have the most dense automobile population, followed by the mining, manufacturing and southern groups in the order named.

It is interesting to note that as regards persons per car the manufacturing states, which in 1920 already had but half as many persons per car by 1.28 during the past year, while the southern states reduced only .58.
