TREES

T His week has been set aside by proclamation of President Harding for general observance as Forest Protection week. During the week the President asks all good citizens to consider what each may do to prevent needless waste of the nation's forest resources, and to act together in restoring the loss that already has been suffered.

Klamath county, as a region in which a large proportion of the nation's standing timber is still untouched, should be vitally interested in Forest Protection, and now is a good time to stop and think of the wealth and the service we receive from our forests; and to pledge our individual aid toward protecting them from fire and insect devastation and from wasteful lumbering methods.

The week is of especial significance because the last day, Saturday, is the fiftleth anniversary of Arbor Day. The first Arbor Day was observed by Nebraska April 22. 1872. It has since become the custom to observe Arbor Day by tree planting and ceremonies in virtually all the states, although all do not observe the same day, differing climatic conditions bringing planting in February in some states and as late as mid-April and May in others.

This year, however, there will be general observance throughout the nation of the golden anniversary. Local organizations are planning a program for Klamath Falls.

It is not the planting of trees on one day alone that will benefit. The actual planting that can be done in one day would be small at the utmost. It is the planting of the tree-loving spirit in the hearts of citizens that will count for the future beautification of the city. The combined effort of all of us, must be actively expended over a period of years to get results, for we start from small beginnings.

Our debt to the forest was once expressed by a governor of Kansas. and his words at this time bear repositing and careful consideration. This is what Governor Stubbs said: "The genial days of spring call


