STAMP IT OUT

In defending the Ku Klux Klan from charges preferred by Governor Olcott in his pre-primary manifesto, officers of the Klan lay great stress upon the absence of any violence in Oregon that can be directly attributed to the Klan.

We'll pass over the Medford outrage, in which a masked mob forcibly abducted a citizen, put a rope around his neck, threatened lynching, and finally turned its victim loose on condition that he should say nothing of the attack.

The Klan, as usual, denied that any members of the order, were responsible. Let the denial stand.

But the Ku Klux Klan is a national organization, guided by one code, governed by one head, functioning, presumably, under the same general regulations in Oregon as in Texas or California.

Let us say there have been no Ku Klux outrages, in Oregon. It's good publicity for outside consumption, and probably will be true enough as the result of the primary's decision.

Let's hide our shame for the time being, and consider California, where they adopt straightforward methods in dealing with the night-roved knights.

The grand jury of Kern county, convened to consider the activities of the Ku Klux in that county, returns the following charge against the organization—the same organization, mind you, that functions under the same general laws and swears allegiance to the same imperial wizard:

"Testimony shows that the members of the organization have taken the law into their own hands. They have forced citizens of this county away from any protection and after removing them to some isolated spot, have suspended their victims with ropes around the neck, flogged them with ropes, tarred and feathered them, assaulted them with guns, and have warned them to leave the county under threat of death. The evidence shows that no investigation was made of the truth of any charges made against the victims, the victim being given no chance whatever to defend himself, even in their own illegal court without any pretense of justice or equality."

The Kern county grand jury calls upon public officials who are members of the Klan to renounce their membership or be removed from office.

They suggest that the next California legislature pass a law making it impossible for such an organization as the Ku Klux Klan to exist in California.

They throw up their hands in figurative honor because the testimony showed that the Klan meeting discussed politics and that one candidate's cards were paid for by the Klan treasury. What would they have done had they been investigating the Oregon Klan, with a wholesale list of candidates for the highest offices at the primary election, if the orange ballot had been an exhibit in the jury room?

California is determined that no ridiculous, unnecessary racial or religious issue shall creep in to disrupt the business progress of the state, and every influence in the state has been set to work to stop the spread of the Klan propaganda.

As a result the fiery cross will be quenched and the Klan call throttled.

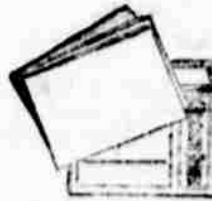
