PETITION

IN THE COUNTY COURT OF THE STATE OF OREGON FOR KLAMATH COUNTY. In the Matter of the Adoption of James Poole, a minor. TO THE HONORABLE COUNTY COURT OF THE COUNTY OF KLAMATH, STATE OF OREGON:

Your petitioners Joseph Albert McCalvey and Flossie C. McCalvey, respectfully represent as follows: That they desire to adopt a minor child, namely, James Poole, as their

own child; and that said child was three years of age on March 18, 1922.

That your petitioners are married, and are husband and wife; and that they are both residents of Klamath Falls, Klamath County, Oregon; That the father of said minor child, James Poole, age unknown, died in Klamath Falls, Oregon on or about the year 1915; that the mother of said minor child, Gladys Poole, has remarried and her name is now Gladys Poole Gamma, and that she is not a resident of the State of Oregon, but is a resident of the State of California; that your petitioners have not gained the consent of the said Gladys Poole Gamma to said adoption;

That said mother of said child did, on or about the 1st day of July, A. D. 1921, willfully desert the said minor child, and has ever since said date continued to willfully desert and neglect to provide proper care and maintenance for said child; that said child has been a public charge and cared for at the county poor farm or hospital since said July 1, 1921;

That your petitioners are of sufficient ability to bring up said child and furnish suitable nurture and education, and that it is fit and proper that such adoption should take effect; that the welfare of such child will be subserved, and its best interests promoted, by such adoption.

Your petitioners therefore pray for an order and decree of this court that from the date of such order and decree the said child shall, to all legal intents and purposes, be the child of the petitioners, and that said child's name be changed to Joseph Albert McCalvey, Jr. JOSEPH ALBERT McCALVEY, FLOSSIE C. McCALVEY.

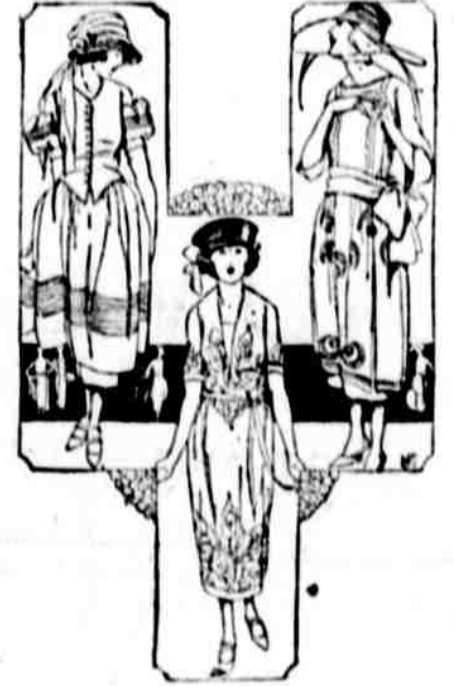
