



The result was that while the state has always been nominally a republican state, it has elected more democrats than republicans more democrats than republicans to high office. Only one repub-lican governor has been elected to succeeded himself, but un-fortunately not living to serve his second term when an acci-dental governor slipped into his shoes. Withycombe is the only republican to be elected governor since the election of Geer in 1898 and during the greater part of and during the greater part of the same period, democrats have represented the state in the U.S. senate.

The recall of the state public service commission and their replacement with untrained men also calls forth editorial disapproval:


