#### DECORATION DAY

TOMORROW the wheels of commerce and industry will slow down, and where possible come to an entire stop, while a nation mourns its dead.

All over the land the living will pay tribute to the men who have died in the nation's defense. Upon the mounds beneath which sleep the soldier dead, upon the surface of the waters that roll above the sailors whose lives have been sacrificed to the cause of Freedom, will be scattered many fragrant flowers.

The custom of observing Memorial Day has come to be generally followed throughout this nation. It grew from the desire on both sides to heal and efface the scars of the Civil War, and the restored fraternal feeling that exists between North and South today is in large part traceable to the charity of broad-minded men and women in both sections who decked alike with blossoms the graves of Blue and Gray and went forth from the cemeteries to pursue the same broad policy in dealing with reconstruction problems among the living.

There is a movement now underway to make the observance of Memorial Day universal throughout the world. Let us hope the sponsors succeed and that the results between all nations will be the same as between the war-sundered parts of this nation—the restoration of friendship, extermination of hatred and suspicion and the eternal end of the worst scourge of mankind—War.

#### FOUND WANTING

THE HERALD is not the only paper in the state that sees in the result of the recent election proof of the inefficiency of the direct primary and the recall. Every newspaper, that comes to our exchange table is crying loud its disapproval of the direct primary system, the weakness of which was so pitilessly exposed in the last tryout. The Grants Pass Courier advocates a thorough "political house-cleaning and a new system of house-keeping."

In its editorial comment the Courier opens its indictment against the primary system with this paragraph:

Oregon's political system won the reputation years ago of being fearfully and wonderfully made. Every new fad and ism was grasped by the people and made the law of the land. The result was that while the state has always been nominally a republican state, it has elected more democrats than republicans to high office. Only one republican governor has been elected to succeed himself, but unfortunately not living to serve his second term when an accidental governor slipped into his shoes. Withycombe is the only republican to be elected governor since the election of Geer in 1898 and during the greater part of the same period, democrats have represented the state in the U. S. senate.

The recall of the state public service commission and their replacement with untrained men also calls forth editorial disapproval:

The recall has also demonstrated its inefficiency. Two men have been discarded because one of the decisions which duty called upon them to make did not meet public approval. Two wholly unknown and untried men are to succeed them, entering upon their duties without a knowledge of the work and no doubt prejudiced through the clamor of the public. The situation has certainly not been improved.

DETROIT, May 29.—President Grable of the brotherhood of maintenance of way employees and railway shop laborers predicted that the executive council would order a strike vote following the wage cut ordered yesterday by the United States railroad labor board.

## IN THE COURT

#### Fouch vs. Washburn

Affidavit of publication and summons and order for publication were filed this morning in the case of Roy N. Fouch against G. E. and Jane Doe Washburn, involving an action on three counts, aggregating \$286.66, and \$50 attorney's fees, all on merchandise accounts.

#### Exhibits Released

As the closing chapter in the confirmation proceedings of the Langell Valley Irrigation district, Judge Leavitt this morning signed an order releasing all of the exhibits offered in the case from which certified copies had been made by the referee. The decree in this case was the last official act of retiring Circuit Judge C. F. Stone.

#### Southern Oregon Auto vs. Lowery

Order granting default judgment for \$144.88 and \$15 costs was signed this morning by Circuit Judge Leavitt in the case of the Southern Oregon Automobile company against Anita Lowery, formerly Mrs. A. G. Laboree. The case was filed about a month ago.

#### Johnson vs. Johnson

Order of default in the divorce case of Rose E. Johnson against Swan Johnson was signed this morning by Judge Leavitt. The date of trial has not been set.

#### State vs. Crater Oil Co.

Order granting the defendant 15 days additional time in which to file an answer, was signed this morning by Judge Leavitt in the case of the State Industrial Accident commission against the Crater Oil and Gas company, involving alleged delinquent assessments due the commission for the protection of the defendant's employees while working on the oil well development.

#### Judge Leavitt Assumes Bench

Judge A. L. Leavitt was sworn in this morning and officially took his new position of circuit judge, and as his first official act signed an order dismissing the case of The Commercial Corporation against C. F. W. Werner of the Lincoln Meat Market, which had been filed about a week ago seeking the collection of \$69.95 for merchandise purchased from S. Birkenwald of Portland. Several other orders and pending matters were taken care of by Judge Leavitt, after which he was kept busy familiarizing

#### Manning vs. Grisez Lbr. Co.

Decree and judgment on six counts aggregating \$1306.20 \$13.20 as lien filing costs, and \$250 attorneys fees was entered this morning by Judge Leavitt in the case of H. M. Manning, substituted as plaintiff instead of Frank E. Dyer, against the Grisez Lumber company, Big Lakes Box company, J. L. Sparretorn and G. C. Lorenz. The decree also provided for a lien on the plant and property of the Grisez Lumber company, and to act as a lien against any interests that the other co-defendants may have in the plant or properties.

#### Shelby vs. Foster

Decree and judgment for \$500 principal, \$75 attorney fees and costs, of \$17.50, was signed this morning by circuit Judge Leavitt in the case of W. A. Shelby against G. W. Josie Foster, which action had been brought to collect on a note of \$500. The decree also provided for an attachment lien on lands in section five, township 38 in this county.
