That your petitioners are married, and are husband and wife; and that they are both residents of Klamath Falls, Klamath County, Oregon.

That the father of said minor child, James Poole, age unknown, died in Klamath Falls, Oregon on or about the year 1919; that the mother of said minor child, Gladys Poole, has remarried and her name is now Gladys Poole Gamma, and that she is not a resident of the State of Oregon, but is a resident of the State of California; that your petitioners have not gained the consent of the said Gladys Poole Gamma to said adoption;

That said mother of said child died, on or about the 1st day of July, A. D. 1921, willfully desert the said minor child, and has ever since said date continued to willfully desert and neglect to provide proper care and maintenance for said child; that said child has been a public charge and cared for at the county poor farm or hospital since said July 1, 1921;
