Cane Maggots at Work

New tender shoots of raspberry and loganberry are frequently found with their tops blighted and curled down in characteristic "limberneck" fashion. A closer examination of the injured cane will reveal a bluish girdle just under the bark at the base of the blighted tip. Cutting into the interior will often show the culpritsmall whitish magget within the pith. Infected canes should be cut out well below the girdle and destroyed as no spray or treatment known at present is effective against this insect.
