For each 3 inch hydrant (2 standard hose connection, 3 inch riser)30

No future installations of hydrants with less than 4 inch riser shall be made.

Other Municipal Use Street sprinkling and sewer flushing, as measured by tanks or orifices, per hundred cubic feet80

Metered Rates—Regular Rate First 300 cubic feet or less, minimum charge as specified below 5-8 meter\$1.75

Special commodity rate for sprinkling, or irrigation use: Applicable only on written demand of customer, and only to metered consumption between the May and September meter readings; for use only residence customers actually using water for sprinkling lawns or gardens and by other customers using water for sprinkling or irrigation purposes only.

First 500 cubic feet, or less, regular rate

For all excess over 500 cubic feet, per 100 cubic feet, 10c.

All irrigation services will be supplied through meters.

Minimum Monthly Charge: According to size of customer's service pipe and meter.
