Because of the nature of the meeting and the type of program that has been arranged, more than 700 delegates are expected to make application for membership in the Tri-State association at the Spokane session, converting the Pacific Northwest Medical association into a Pacific Coast association.

The Spokane meeting, it is announced, is unique in that every man on the program is of international reputation in his particular line of work. Some of those who will take part in the program are Professor J. C. Bloodgood, an international authority on cancer as it attacks women; Dr. Walter H. Cannon, professor of physiology at Harvard medical school; Dr. E. C. Rosenow of the Mayo Foundation for Research and Teaching, who will lecture on "Infected Tonils and Teeth as a cause of Ill Health;" Dr. Frank Billings for many years dean of the faculty of Rush Medical college, who will speak on "Problems of Present Day Medical Practice."
