PLANING MILL BURNS

Spontaneous Combustion Is Blamed for Sacramento Fire

SACRAMENTO, June 27.—Spontaneous combustion occurring in a pile of sawdust in the rear of the office building of Burnett & Son, planing mill proprietors on R street between Twenty-third and Twenty-fourth streets, is held responsible for a fire which destroyed the office building, planing mill and lumber shed of the company yesterday afternoon.

Fire department officials said the loss probably was in the neighborhood of \$25,000. G. H. Burnett estimated the loss at between \$50,000 and \$75,000. He said some insurance was carried.

MASONS RAP KU KLUX

Statement By Massachusetts Grand Master Condens Klan

BOSTON, June 27.—A letter declaring the Ku Klux Klan, "an un-Masonic organization, utterly without Masonic support or sympathy," has been sent to all Masonic lodges of the state by Arthur D. Prince, grand master of the Massachusetts grand lodge.

The letter, made public here today, says that "as a grand lodge we would take no interest in the organization but for the claims made by its officers and organizers that its membership is largely Masonic and it has Masonic approval and support."

"This statement," Mr. Prince's letter continued, "is absolutely false, as the Klan has no connection with and neither does it have the support of any Masonic jurisdiction."

The avowed principles of the Klan, Prince asserted, "violate Masonic law at every point and it would be impossible for me to conceive of a Ma-
