the Southern Pacific and the Central Pacific lines was contrary to the anti-trust law and issued an order for divorcing those two lines. This order has been held in abeyance for 60 days to give the Southern Pacific system opportunity to file a petition for a rehearing.

In the meantime the Union Pacific system has entered the field, and has announced its intention of combatting the right of the Southern Pacific to the control of the Central Pacific lines.

The controversy over the control of the Central Pacific will come up at a hearing before the Interstate commerce commission, probably in October. The transportation act of 1920 gave that body authority to group the major railroads of the country into a series of systems. Whether that body would have a right to go contrary to a ruling of the United States supreme court is a matter for legal controversy.
