County Court Proceedings ORDER PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUE AND SALE OF BONDS AND SALE OF BONDS

IN THE COUNTY COURT OF THE
STATE OF OREGON, FOR THE
COUNTY OF KLAMATH

In the matter of issuance of bonds by Klamath County for the purpose of raising money to be used for the construction and maintenance of permanent roads in the County.

Whereas, at an election duly called and held in Klamath County on the 21st day of February, 1922, an issue of bonds for the building of permanent roads in said County was duly authorized by the voters in the sum of eight hundred thousand dollars (\$800,000), together with interest thereon, said bonds to run as follows, to-wit:

- \$20,000 seven years from date of issue;
- \$26,000 eight years from date of issue;
- \$31,000 nine years from date of issue;
- \$36,000 ten years from date of issue;
- \$41,000 eleven years from date of issue;
- \$46,000 twelve years from date of issue;
- \$51,000 thirteen years from date of issue;
- \$56,000 fourteen years from date of issue;
- \$61,000 fifteen years from date of issue;
- \$66,000 sixteen years from date of issue;
- \$72,000 seventeen years from date of issue;
- \$78,000 eighteen years from date of issue;
- \$84,000 nineteen years from date of issue;
- \$90,000 twenty years from date of issue.

and to bear interest at the rate of not to exceed five and one-half per cent (5 1/2%) per annum; and

Whereas, it now becomes the duty of the County Court to cause the aforesaid bonds to be issued and to advertise such amount of them for sale as in the judgment of the Court may be necessary; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the County Court it is now necessary to issue and sell four hundred thousand dollars (\$400,000) of the aforesaid bonds, Now Therefore,

It is hereby ordered that Klamath County do issue its bonds in the sum of eight hundred dollars (\$800,000) per value in amount, in denominations of one thousand dollars (\$1,000) each, numbered 1 to 800 inclusive, said bonds to bear date April 1, 1922, to mature as follows, to-wit:

- \$20,000 seven years from date of issue;
- \$26,000 eight years from date of issue;
- \$31,000 nine years from date of issue;
- \$36,000 ten years from date of issue;

said purpose in said County on the 21st day of February 1922, held in pursuance of law and under and by virtue of an order of the County Court of said County after due notice given at which said election an indebtedness in the sum of eight hundred thousand dollars (\$800,000) and interest thereon was authorized by said voters to be created for the building of permanent roads in said County.

And it is hereby certified that every requirement of law relating to the issue hereof has been duly complied with and that this bond is within every debt and other limit prescribed by the constitution or law of the State of Oregon and that for the punctual payment of the principal and interest thereon the full faith and credit of Klamath County is hereby irrevocably pledged.

In witness whereof the County of Klamath has caused its seal to be hereunto affixed and this bond to be signed by the County Judge and County Clerk and the annexed coupons to bear the fac-simile signature of the said officers this first day of April, 1922.

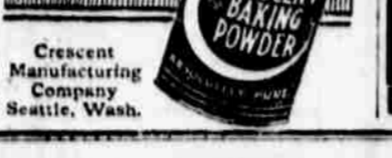
