SUPPOSE you had undertaken the construction of a fine dwelling, had picked out a firm foundation, enlisted a crew of willing workers and were laying bricks diligently.

Then suppose a rabble would come along, interfere with the workers, remove the bricks from the walls, before the mortar had time to set about them, cast them on the ground, and criticize and deride you for your lack of progress.

It wouldn't take you long to become impatient. If you were ultra-lawabiding you would probably call the police. But most of us would feel called upon to leave a few bricks.

There are a class of citizens in this community who are constantly striving to build a noble edifice, to uprear the walls of the city of the future.

There is another class, who are constantly tearing down and setting at naught the efforts of the builders—"knockers" against whom the chamber of commerce secretary has launched a justifiable and entirely commendable campaign.

Constructive criticism should be welcomed by any individual or organization, and we do not suppose the chamber of commerce is seeking to escape its share of helpful suggestions.

We take it that the ban is directed at the harmful and foolish habit of holding street corner post-mortems on every community movement that arises. In these discussions the "knocker" is in his element, and one of the ilk can knock the underpinning from under progressive ideas faster than a whole organization can set it up.

When we were boys we developed our pitching arms by hurling rocks through the windows of deserted dwellings. We shudder now when we think of the extent of the wanton destruction of property—and we never made the big league either.

That is some of us shudder. That portion who have outgrown such vandalism with other prouler attributes. The remainder have not grown mentally, although they have developed greater destructive capabilities and enlarged the field of action.

We trust that the chamber of commerce will be able to figuratively get some of the grown culprits into the customary position between knee and elbow and attain the same chastening effect that broke the boyish vandal.

LONDON—Advance showing of autumn styles indicate that a short cape in natural black skunk is likely to find high favor, both for


