Under strike conditions best explained by Chairman Ben W. Hooper of the U. S. R. R. Labor Board, in his statement of July First reading as follows:

"In this case the conflict is not between the employer and the oppressed employees. The people of this country, through an act of congress signed by President Wilson established a tribunal to decide conditions which are submitted to it in a proper manner over such dispute. It is the decisions of this tribunal against which the shop crafts are striking. Regardless of any question of the right of men to strike the men who take strikers places are merely accepting wages and working conditions prescribed by a government tribunal and are performing a public service. They are not accepting the wages and working conditions which an employer is trying to impose. For this reason public sentiment and fair government power will protect the men who remain in their positions and new men who may come in."

Adequate provisions have been made for the full protection of all new employees the same as old employees who have remained loyally at work. Applicants should apply to the office of the Superintendent of Portland Union Station, or to the assistant Superintendent at Roseburg.

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### NOTICE SPECIAL BOND AND CONTRACT ELECTION SHAFTS VIEW IRRIGATION DISTRICT

Notice is hereby given that a special election will be held on Friday, 28th day of July 1922, at the herein-after specified polling place in Shasta View Irrigation District, Klamath County, Oregon, to determine whether bonds of said District in the sum of One Hundred Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$120,000.00) shall be issued for the purpose of providing funds for procuring necessary reclamation works, acquiring the necessary property and rights therefor, for the purchase and acquisition of canals, water rights, and for work and construction, and for otherwise carrying out the provisions of law, and for the further purpose of voting upon the following question:

"Shall the Shasta View Irrigation District of Klamath County, Oregon enter into a contract with the United States of America for a water right for the lands of said District wherein and whereby the maximum amount to be paid for said water right is to be thirty-four dollars per acre for each and every irrigable acre within boundaries of the said District and an annual operation and maintenance charge equal to one-half of the acre charge assessed against the lands of the Klamath Project and an equitable proportion of any expense incurred by the United States in regulating the water level of Upper Klamath Lake and the proportionate part of the cost of additional drainage upon the Klamath Project made necessary by the increased seepage upon the Klamath project caused by the work provided for in said contract, not exceeding, however, ten dollars per acre for such drainage."

The polls shall be opened at eight o'clock on the morning of the election, and be kept open until five o'clock in the afternoon, when the same must be closed.

At such election, the ballots shall contain the words "BONDS—YES" and "BONDS—NO," and the words "CONTRACT WITH THE UNITED STATES—YES" and "CONTRACT WITH THE UNITED STATES—NO."

The Board of Directors have specified the following polling place in said District for said election: The Shasta View School House located approximately in the Southeast quarter of Southeast quarter of Section 6, Township 41 South, Range 12 East of the Willamette Meridian within the boundaries of said District.

Said election must be held and the result thereof determined and declared in all respects as nearly as practical in conformity with the provisions of law governing the election of officers.
