

# ACCUSED SLAYER 'CAVE BOY'

GARDLAND, Cal., Aug. 1.—A "cave boy" born a half a million years ago and roaming modern streets trafficked with the latest mechanical devices of a domineering civilization.

A "cave boy," makes his knotted club, waiting for prey, just as he would have waited in prehistoric times.

Such is the amazing analysis of Frank Avila, 17-year-old alleged "cave boy" and "killer" made by Elaine Lincoln Benedict, noted character analyst.

Avila, charged with murder, may face the nation. Without any reason he can describe, this lad, according to the charges, approached a woman he had never seen before, William Reinking, and struck a blow that brought death.

Doesn't Know Why  
"I don't know why," repeats the "throughback" to the days of primitive man. "I hit him just for the devil of it."

Investigation has shown Avila's mind to be dazed with uncontrolled impulses "to hit somebody" at least so police records show. The records show also that on the occasion of the murder, Avila was sitting on a fence with four other boys when the stranger passed; that Avila suddenly expressed a desire to "get that guy" and then proceeded to trail Reinking.
