Episcopal Church to Publish Book to Aid In Raising Big Fund

CHICAGO, Aug. 8.—The Episcopal church is about to publish a book which is expected to bring returns amounting to more than \$21,000,000, it is the "survey" or budget which will be presented at the triennial general convention of the church which meets at Portland, Oregon, in September.

The survey will explain in detail the missionary, educational and social service works of the Episcopal Church, both in the United States and in foreign lands which call for the support of the church for the next three years. Besides the \$21,000,000 budget there are several lists of "priority" asking for advance projects. One of these is for \$1,000,000 for building projects in the various church colleges.

The General Convention also will be asked to change the title of the present governing body from the "President Bishop and Council" to "National Council," and that of the "Department of the Nation-wide Campaign" to "Field Department."
