INSANITY HELD POOR DEFENSE

American Bar Association Speaker Deplores Present Court Methods

SAN FRANCISCO, Aug. 9.—Insanity as a defense should be done away with in criminal trials because it not only tends to leave society unprotected from the acts of persons acquitted on this ground but also becomes a cloak for crimes committed under the "unwritten law," declared Curtis D. Wilbur, associate justice of the supreme court of California, in an address today before the judicial section of the American Bar association.

"At present the defense of insanity is a trap for the insane and a way of escape for the sane," he said. "It is a humbug, a pretense, a cloak for hypocrisy, an invitation to murder all too frequently accepted by the jealous lover, the discarded mistress, the indignant father or outraged husband."

He said the "unwritten law" had taken such hold of the imagination of the people that the trial of a murderer became the trial of the dead man, whose villainies are exaggerated as a cause for the defendant becoming insane.

Judge Wilbur, who has figured prominently in juvenile and adult probation work and care of the insane in California, proposed that insanity no longer be treated as a defense to a criminal charge, that evidence on the subject be excluded from a jury trying a criminal case and that a board of alienists after conviction decide whether the defendant be committed to a state hospital, prison, or released under probationary supervision to a private hospital or other custody, the state retaining jurisdiction for at least as long as the maximum term of imprisonment for the offense.

"It is obviously dangerous to release an insane person who has committed one murder, or rather who has innocently killed some unsuspecting and unoffending bystander, because under the same influences he may kill another when the occasion arises," the speaker explained. "His very innocence of wrong motives and inadequacy of provocation make him a greater menace to society than the willful wrongdoer."

"Expert witnesses" were scored by Judge Wilbur, who said their testimony was frequently so conflicting as hopelessly to bewilder a jury. "The expert should be called in by the state to act in an impartial judicial state of mind," he said, "and not to search for reasons or arguments to sustain the position of either the prosecution or the defense."

PORTUGUESE TELL OF NEAR BATTLE

Conflict With Chinese Forces Gave Promise of Becoming Open Warfare

SHANGHAI, Aug. 9.—In a formal statement issued by the Portuguese government of Macao a report is presented of the recent conflict between Chinese and Portuguese forces which for days gave promise of resulting in open warfare.

The government's statement asserts the disturbance developed on May 25 when an African soldier of the Mocambique Expeditionary Force was assaulted after having an altercation with several Chinese. The soldier, the report says, was so badly injured that he was taken to a hospital and one of his assailants was arrested, being taken to the police station at Chi-peng.

A mob then assembled at the police station and attempted to storm it, the report sets forth, to obtain the release of the Chinese held prisoner, and it was when the gathering grew into thousands it was deemed necessary to send for reinforcements and an infantry company was sent to the scene.

The Chinese mob fired upon and stoned the infantrymen, according to the report, and refusing to disperse barricaded the streets near the police station in the night and called a general strike the following morning, menacing all who attempted to open their shops or go to work.

It was made known that the prisoner had been handed over to the court authorities and bail was fixed for his release, statement continues, but no bail was offered and the mob then prevented steam launches from mooring at the wharf and drove away those who desired to embark for Hongkong. The report says that at noon on May 29 a Portuguese officer who sought to execute an order at the Macao Steamboat company's wharf was set upon, disarmed and narrowly escaped being thrown into the sea. While this incident was taking place, the report says, the mob began to fire and an African soldier of the Mocambique expeditionary force was killed instantly. It was then that the troops fired at the mob killing several and wounding others. When the gathering took flight orders to stop firing were issued.

The government established martial law after the outbreak and elaborate precautions were taken to preserve order. A news report issued from Chinese sources in connection with the trouble said that the outbreak developed originally after a negro soldier had made an attack upon a Chinese woman.

Street Car Passe Tried Out in Tacoma

TACOMA, Wash., Aug. 9.—Weekly street car passes are being tried out here by the local traction company for a four month's period, and so far have been popular with patrons. The passes, which sell for \$1, are good for rides from Monday morning until the next Sunday night and are transferable to anyone. The single street car fare here is ten cents, or 12 tickets for \$1.

The street car company points out that every pass purchaser is certain to get more than 12 rides on his pass and it is figured the average number of rides on each is about 25. In the case of passengers or others who travel a great deal on street cars the passes are used so frequently that the fare actually is reduced to one cent a ride. The system has been used in a middlewest, but never before on the Pacific coast.
