SCIENTIFIC AND INDUSTRIAL PARLEY AT RIO DE JANEIRO

WASHINGTON, Aug. 16.—Conferences for the discussion of scientific and industrial progress and development, to which representatives from all nations have been invited, will be held during September and October at Rio de Janeiro in conjunction with the Brazilian centennial exposition, according to announcement today by the American commission to the exposition.

Subjects discussed at one of the conferences will be the development of cotton production in Brazil and foreign countries, the seasons being held under the auspices of the National agricultural society. A National chemical congress, admitting foreign participation also will be held at which there will be a general discussion of questions of chemistry and their application to the needs of the industrial progress of Brazil. A national fuel congress, to be divided into three sections, dealing with scientific, technical, industrial and economic aspects, will be confined, it was said, to problems which confront Brazil. Other congresses will deal with agriculture and stock raising, engineering and railroad construction, hydroelectricity, anthropology and archaeology, medicine and surgery.

Famous Alaskan Ship Fails to Come Back

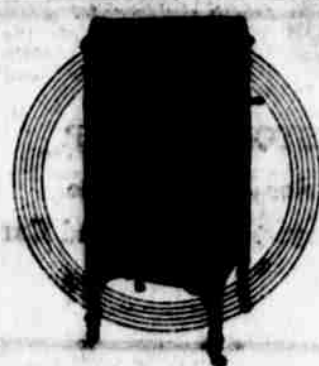
SEATTLE, Wash., Aug. 16.—For 30 years known as the ship that "always came back" from the Arctic, the Bender Brothers, a sturdy little ice-fighting craft, failed to live up to her name this summer when she was caught in the ice of Okhotsk Sea, off the Kamchatka coast.

"She did all a vessel could to win," said her master, Captain Edward O. Haugen, who, with several other survivors, reached here recently. "The floating, grinding ice floes of the Okhotsk battered the Bender Brothers to death."

Captain told how he and the crew, after the boat went down, in the Bender's launch, towing the ship's lifeboat, worked their way down the wild Kamchatka coast for seven days. Their supplies only permitted two meals a day until they reached a Russian settlement at the Tigil river. There several of the crew remained behind while the captain and two other officers braved the 750-mile stretch of seas to Petropolaaki, another Siberian port. Word of the wreck was sent from there to the American consul at Yokohama and in a short time a Japanese fishing vessel appeared along the coast and picked up the Bender's company.

PARIS—Nightgowns, though not gorgeous as to material or coloring, have become so very chic that they might well be worn on the boulevards. The favorite fashion at present is that which requires two long, perfectly straight rectangles of silk or cotton crepe. The rectangles are joined at the shoulders by bright ribbons, and held at waist and hem in similar fashion. The hem is finished with stitchery or picoting.

The high crown has a draped effect. Through the crown, on each side over the ear, is thrust a sheaf of stiff quills, head down. OLD KESWICK COPPER SMELTER IS SOON TO DISAPPEAR FROM MAP

REDDING, Cal., Aug. 16.—Keswick, an old copper smelter and mining town near here, which had a population of close to 2500 in 1900, is soon to be taken from the face of the map.

Several years ago the big smelter, which provided employment for hundreds, was moved away and now the completion of an aerial tram-

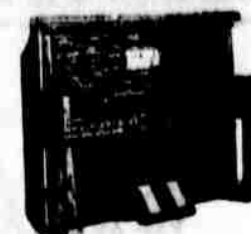
way makes Keswick unnecessary as a loading point of ore.
