Portland Ball Park Has Record Number of Home Runs This Year

PORLTAND, Aug. 26.—Nearly one and one-half home runs to a game—1.4 to be exact—have been knocked out in the Portland park of the Pacific coast baseball league this season. Nothing like it ever has been seen here before, and the average, if kept up all season, will make a total of 141, compared with 87 last year. The 57th homer this year was hit by Brown of Oakland on August 3.

Up to the middle of August, there had been 102 four-baggers in 73 games. Of this number, the Beavers hit 56 and the opposing clubs 45. Jimmy Middleton and Rube Walberg were the principal Portland pitchers to yield over-the-fence smacks, with eight off each, while four visiting pitchers were nuked for four home runs apiece. The greatest sufferer in any one game was Kung of Sacramento, who was hit for four of them in one afternoon, the disaster occurring on Decoration Day.

The balls used here evidently have jackrabbits hidden inside of them, according to the best opinion among local small boys.
