Beatrice Sant Will Be Tried September 27

SPOKANE, Wash., Sept. 4.—Mrs. Beatrice Sant, who is accused of giving perjured testimony at the trial of Maurice Codd, acquitted on a murder charge here last spring, will be tried in superior court September 27, according to the criminal docket recently announced.

Mrs. Rosa Fagen, also accused of perjury in the Codd case, will not be tried until October 2. Rollie Fryett, J. L. Cook and Fred Botts, also indicted by the grand jury and charged with tampering with Codd witnesses, will be tried by October 4.
