LUMBER CARS NEEDED

Shortage Felt By Industry Throughout United States

CHICAGO, Sept. 8.—The lumber industry throughout the country is still looking for cars to make shipments and hoping that embargoes may soon be lifted. For the week ending August 19 the various associations reporting to the National Lumber Manufacturers' association showed a slight drop in production, shipments of only 88 per cent of the cut, but orders 95 per cent.

It is evident that mills are turning down orders and thus holding down new business on account of their inability to ship much stock already cut and dry, according to A. Fletcher Marsh, chairman of the American Wholesale Lumber association.

Among the individual associations the volume of southern pine new bookings continue to be the highest, although their shipments are 20 per cent under new business, and some of the mills east of the Mississippi still shipping nothing.

POURING CONCRETE AT NIGHT ON WEED ROAD
