**Car Prices Soaring**

**High in Great Britain**

DETROIT, Sept. 11.—"With gasoline selling at 65 cents a gallon and an 18-pound tax on the cheapest motorcar, only the comparatively rich man in England can afford to drive an automobile," said A. T. Davy, one of the editors of "Engineering Production," a leading technical journal, during a recent visit to the main plant of the Cadillac Motorcar company.  
Many interesting sidelights on motoring in the British Isles were related by the engineer during his trip through the Cadillac factory. He said that the largest production of any motorcar concern in England was by Austin at Birmingham, who makes 129 cars a week. This machine sells for about \$3000.  
Custom-made bodies are almost universally the rule in England, according to Davy. He explained that all those who could afford a fine motorcar preferred to have an individual body, especially after paying the high price asked for an imported car.
