NOTICE ELECTION SUNNYSIDE IRRIGATION DISTRICT

Notice is hereby given that at the annual election to be held on Tuesday, Oct. 10, 1922, at the hereinafter specified polling place in the Sunnyside Irrigation District, Klamath County, Oregon, for the purpose of voting upon the following questions: "Shall the Sunnyside Irrigation District of Klamath County, Oregon, enter into a contract with the United States of America for a water right for the lands of said district wherein and whereby the maximum to be paid for said water right is to be thirty-four dollars per acre for each and every irrigable acre within boundaries of the said district and an annual operation and maintenance charge equal to one-half of the acre charge assessed against the lands of the Klamath Project and an equitable proportion of any expense incurred by the United States in regulating the water level of Upper Klamath Lake."

The polls shall be opened at eight o'clock in the morning of the election and be kept open until five o'clock in the afternoon, when the same must be closed. At such election the ballots shall contain the words: "Contract With the United States—Yes" and "Contract With the United States—No."
