The surprisingly unwholesome conditions which obtain in some parts of the community where small children are growing up, and the environment in which they are subjected was revelation to those who are not in close touch with the work now carried on, and the problems presented have material for the most careful consideration.

It was decided to maintain a booth at the coming county fair where Miss Fricke could be interviewed by those wishing her advice and where children may be weighed and examined.

That Mrs. Sadie Orr Dunbar, executive secretary of the Oregon tuberculosis association, Dr. Estelle F. Warner, medical director of state child hygiene, Mrs. G. M. Blakely, state advisory nurse, and other notable authorities on the work now carried on in Klamath county, will be present for the annual dinner and meeting of the association on the evening of October 3, at the Chamber of commerce, has been definitely learned and preparations for this event are actively under way.

The harmonious concerted efforts of the Public Health association, the Klamath county court and the American Red Cross have brought about results during the past year which are gratifying to those who have participated and it is believed that those who are called to carry on the work will have an interesting and busy term.
