

RETAIL PRICES DROP

Cost of Food to Average Family Decreased Two Per Cent

WASHINGTON, Sept. 21.—The retail cost of food to the average family in the United States decreased two per cent in the month ending August 15, according to figures made public today by the bureau of labor statistics of the department of labor, based on reports from 51 cities. Nineteen cities showed a decrease of one per cent or less, while Butte and Seattle showed increases of less than one-half of one per cent.

Alexandria and so started a train of events which brought Egypt under British influence.

CONSTANTINOPLE, Sept. 21.—General Harington of the British army, in chief command of the allied forces, has issued a communique in which he declares the responsibility for consequences of violations of the neutral zone will fall upon the authors of such violations.

ATHENS, Sept. 21.—According to information in official circles, the French naval units occupied Mudania and insisted upon the surrender of several regiments of Greek troops who were seeking to reach the sea to embark homeward. The report caused excitement in Greek circles. With thousands of refugees arriving daily from Asia Minor and an insufficient wheat supply, Greece is confronted with a food problem so grave that international help is immediately necessary to save thousands from starvation.

ROME, Italy, Sept. 21.—It was officially announced today by Roumania that she will not permit any action by Bulgaria which would change the present status in the Balkans, and that she is ready if necessary to adopt military measures.

CONSTANTINOPLE, Sept. 21.—French and Italian detachments and flags were withdrawn today from the neutral zones of Ismid and the Dardanelles on orders of the respective governments.
