Dog Fish Held To Produce Fine Oil

VICTORIA, B. C., Sept. 26.—Manufacture of dog fish oil on a large scale is planned by British Columbia interests, according to a recent report to the parliamentary fisheries commission by A. T. Hankey, minister of Victoria.

Hankey stated that it would be necessary to use fish traps to make the catches in paying quantities and considered it advisable to ascertain the attitude of the commission regarding the use of traps before starting operations. The salmon industry in northern waters has suffered considerably from the use of traps and at present they are in great disfavor with governmental authorities, say local fishermen.

According to Hankey, all arrangements have been made and if permission is given for the use of the traps the new industry will commence operations on the Queen Charlotte Islands, on Skidegate Inlet, with one plant, employing about 200 men.
