HELD VERBAL RODEO

District Attorney and Mrs. Blowers Have Talk in Courtroom

A verbal rodeo was staged in the circuit room yesterday when Mrs. Ollie D. Blowers, indicted for murder, and her counsel appeared to enter notice and demurrer for dismissal of the indictment. Both were denied and the defendant entered a plea of not guilty. Her trial was set for October 23. This disposed of Judge Leavitt asked District Attorney Brower whether 2 o'clock Friday would suit him as a time to meet and fix the criminal calendar. Brower said it would. "I didn't know but perhaps you wanted to attend the festivities," said Judge Leavitt. "The state of Oregon has no time for festivities," replied Brower. Judge Leavitt left the bench and retired. Mrs. Blowers turned to Brower and said: "Apparently, Mr. Brower, you are not very patriotic."

Then the rodeo started. Turning to Mrs. Blowers, Brower said several things, ending with, "And I don't want to hear any more out of you." This was the signal for Mrs. Blowers' attorney, Myers, to join the fray. And he did, verbally, to some extent. He called for Judge Leavitt, to whom he declared that his client had been subject to insult. Judge Leavitt listened carefully, then declared the rodeo over. The riders left. The state of Oregon's representative that afternoon went to the rodeo.
