SAN FRANCISCO, Oct. 5.—Thirty-seven Southern Pacific veterans, one of whom, Frank Englebright, master car repairer, has been with the company 52 years and 19 months, were "graduated" to the pension rolls of the company recently, making 1,969 retired to the pension list since 1903.

Englebright helped to try out and install the first air brakes sent to the west by George Westinghouse, the inventor, in 1871. Prior to that all braking was done by hand. Englebright has been stationed in Oakland.
