Referring to the Natron cut-off, we have a telegraphic statement from the president of the Union Pacific Pacific would complete the Natron cat-off in case they gained a controling interest in the Central Pavitic The Southern Pacific executive committee also offially announces that as seen as the litigation is over and they are assured that their lines will remain intact, the completion of the Natron cul-off will be started immediately. It would seem, therefore, that this line is assured and the interest of the country will be directed to the railroad company that would likely be in the position to complete the line at the earliest period after the present controversy is ended.

Klamath county has two possibilitheir to secure an outlet to the east, One by way of Modoc Northern. which survey we understand is complete, and the other is the proposed connection detween Crane and Odell connecting with the Klamath-Natron line. It is the opinion of the committee that the Modoc Northern would be more beneficial to the agriultural, livestock and lumber ship pers of the county and the citizens as a whole than the road thru Eastern Oregon, as it will open up for development one of the richest agricultural sections of the Northwest. namely the Tule Lake Basin, with Klamath Falls the trading center.

We cannot look forward with much hope for immediate development under an independent Central try. Furthermore, the Transportation act orders the L. C. C. to combine the railroads into large groups of competitive lines. In the face of this it is not likely the Central Pacific will be made independent.

So far as we know, the only other line interested in the Central Pacific. besides the Union Pacific and Southern Pacific, is the Hill Lines, and no promise of development has come from this source.

In summing up our recommendations, we have to report that our committee is unanimous in the statements that we make, and we believe that if the interests of the county can unite behind the program that we have outlined, it will be a forward step to the general prosperity of not only our own county, but Southern Oregon as well.

As mentioned above, we can expect relief from heavy freight rates when the Natron cut-off is completed, and from the information given out by the railroad officials, we are of the opinion that the construction will be completed carlier under the Southern Pacific control than either under the Union Pacific or the independent Central Pacific. In view of the Union Pacific's strategic position on the Pacific coast at the present time, we do not believe that the Interstate Commerce commission will take the Central Pacific lines away from the Southern Pacific, which we all realize will seriously cripple that organization and turn them over the the Union Pacific, which would make it the dominating and controlling road of the western territory, and we can
