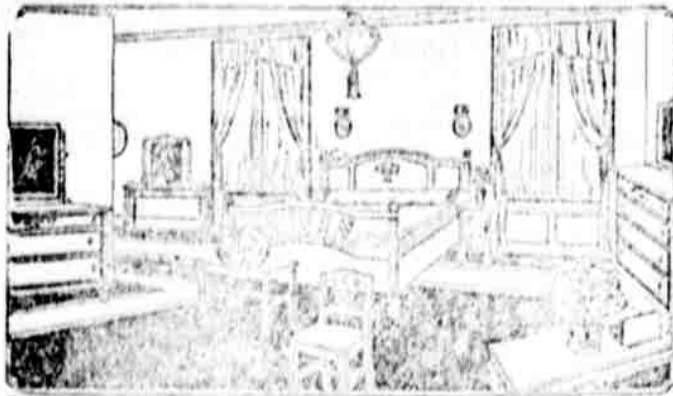

Federal Land Bank Amendment Designed To Increase Loans

CHICAGO, Oct. 11.—An amendment to the federal land bank act designed to increase the farm loan been prepared for adoption by the American farm bureau federation, which officers announce, also will be favored by the farm bloc.

"In the order to meet the March 1, 1923 payments, it will be necessary for this legislation to be passed before January 1, 1923, as it takes 60 days following application to get a farm loan through," declared President J. R. Howard.

TEMPERANCE HEAD SAYS PROHIBITION AT WORST IS BEST

PRINCETON, Ill., Oct. 11.—Prohibition at its worst is better than license at its best, declared Clarence True Wilson, secretary of the board of temperance, prohibition and public morals of the Methodist Episcopal church in reporting today a five months' survey by that board of conditions in Chicago. It was made to the Rock River Methodist conference.

Secretary Wilson said that Chicago was selected for this study "because it was desired to discover prohibition at its worst." The committee compared wet and dry years in their relation to crime, welfare and relief, health, thrift and prosperity and general business conditions. In each case, he said, the advantage was shown to exist since the advent of prohibition days.

"The effect upon crime alone fully justifies the policy of prohibition in Chicago," the report states. "At the same time, a note of alarm must be sounded. Current crime statistics plainly reveal that the wet propaganda intended to incite uninformed or evil-minded people to violation of the prohibition law and to the consumption of liquor is having an effect. Good results, so noticeable at first, are being modified."

The report cites statistics of the medical superintendent of the house of correction who stated that in 1918, 345 cases of acute alcoholism were reported and in 1921 this number decreased to 61. Chronic alcoholism cases in 1918 totaled 1,614 and dropped to 127 in 1921. Three cases of delirium tremens were reported in 1921 as compared with 109 in 1918.

"While the bank clearings in 1921 were almost the same as in 1918, the total savings deposits increased from \$219,426,513 to \$509,086,968. Employers of labor throughout the city

almost invariably declare that prohibition has increased efficiency, decreased absenteeism, and improved the general physical condition of the men. The real estate situation has been distinctly helped."

CONFIRMS S. P. OWNERSHIP.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 11.—The Southern Pacific's claim to lands retained under land grants, which was challenged by the Peoples Development company of California, was confirmed in effect by the supreme court of the United States in affirming a decision of the lower federal courts adverse to the development company. The lands' question were valued at \$19,999,000.

The development company claimed title under mineral location laws.
